AMENDMENT NO. 2
Proposed by Initiative Petition
Do you want to amend the Missouri Constitution to: • allow the Missouri Gaming Commission to
regulate licensed sports wagering including online sports betting, gambling boats, professional sports betting districts and
mobile licenses to sports betting operators; • restrict sports betting to individuals physically located in the state and over the
age of 21; • allow license fees prescribed by the Commission and a 10% wagering tax on revenues received to be appropriated for
education after expenses incurred by the Commission and required funding of the Compulsive Gambling Prevention Fund; and
allow for the general assembly to enact laws consistent with this amendment? State governmental entities estimate
onetime costs of \$660,000, ongoing annual costs of at least \$5.2 million, and initial license fee revenue of \$11.75 million.
Because the proposal allows for deductions against sports gaming revenues, they estimate unknown tax revenue ranging from
\$0 to \$28.9 million annually. Local governments estimate unknown revenue.

Proposed by Initiative Petition
Do you want to amend the Missouri Constitution to: • establish a right to make decisions about
reproductive health care, including abortion and contraceptives, with any governmental interference of that right presumed invalid;
remove Missouri's ban on abortion; allow regulation of reproductive health care to improve or maintain the health of the patient;
require the government not to discriminate, in government programs, funding, and other activities, against persons providing or
obtaining reproductive health care; and allow abortion to be restricted or banned after Fetal Viability except to protect the life
or health of the woman? State governmental entities estimate no costs or savings, but unknown impact. Local
governmental entities estimate costs of at least \$51,000 annually in reduced tax revenues. Opponents estimate a potentially
significant loss to state revenue.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 5

State governmental entities estimate onetime costs of \$763,000, ongoing costs of \$2.2 million annually, initial fee revenue of \$271,000, ongoing admission and other fee revenue of \$2.1 million annually, and annual gaming tax revenue of \$14.3 million. Local governments estimate unknown revenue.

- allow the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to provide oversight and enforcement; and
- exempt governmental entities, political subdivisions, school districts and education institutions?

State governmental entities estimate onetime costs ranging from \$0 to \$53,000, and ongoing costs ranging from \$0 to at least \$256,000 per year by 2027. State and local government tax revenue could change by an unknown annual amount depending on business decisions.
